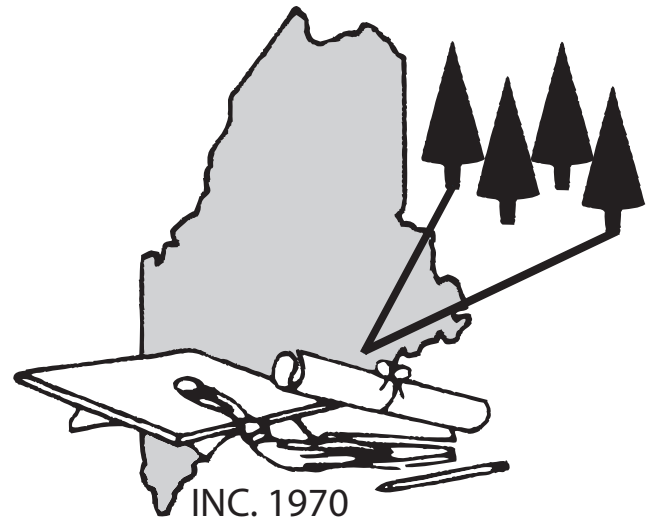


Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why is the School Based Health Clinic in RSU #22?
 - Supplement and streamline current health services
 - Allow students to be seen for acute illness and/or testing
 - Offer a primary care option for students who do not have consistent healthcare
 - Focus on public health needs of the student population
 - Obesity Prevention
 - Drug and Alcohol Education
 - Mental Health Services
 - Improve the school environment
 - Vaccination Clinics
 - Health Fairs
 - Education sessions
2. How is the Health Center Funded?
 - Joint Support from RSU #22 and Eastern Maine Medical Center
 - Sponsorships
 - Grant submissions
 - Your health insurance such as MaineCare, Anthem, or other insurance companies will be charged for visits
3. Do all students get to participate in the School Based Health Clinic?
 - All students are eligible to participate in the School Based Health Clinic. Parents and students need to complete the Opt in Form along with consent to care forms.
 - No student will be denied the use of the School Based Health Clinic based on the ability to pay.
4. What are the goals of the School Based Health Clinic?
 - Improve the health of the student population
 - Improve the environment within the school
 - Provide support to families who may find it difficult to access health services during the school day or year



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
