

Welcome to the Hampden Academy Bands. It is my hope that participation in these performing groups will bring you a lifetime of enjoyment!

The Hampden Academy Bands have been very fortunate to receive the necessary support from the administration and community to maintain a reputation as being one New England's most outstanding musical organizations. Each year we do our best to maintain this long standing tradition by adhering to the necessary protocol.

- I. WE will begin each rehearsal promptly at 8:06 a.m. Please be in your seat ready to go at this time. Repeated tardiness will have an impact on your grade. (See Grading) Consistency is KEY! Each day you will find the music order will be listed on the board. Please take time to get things in order so that we do not waste rehearsal time.
- II. DISTRACTIONS in rehearsal do not allow us to become the best ensemble we can be. Please remain engaged throughout rehearsal and do not use it as time to complete homework from another class. At this point, chrome books sometimes are needed in rehearsal. When not needed, please keep them in your backpacks. Repeat offenses will have a negative impact on your grade. (See Grading)
- III. USE of the hall pass is not to be abused. If you have a medical condition that requires you to leave class, please let me know. Otherwise, repeated daily use of the pass may result in discontinued use.
- IV. GRADING in the HA Bands will be based on the following criteria.
 - A. Rehearsal Skills- You will receive a weekly rating (1-5 star rating)*
 - 1. Be in your seat on time with all materials needed for rehearsal.
 - 2. Remain engaged throughout the warm -up and rehearsal process.
 - 3. Respond to director's verbal and non-verbal gestures.
 - 4. Band Study with Mr. Michaud I will focus meeting with Freshmen and Sophomore band members. Please make an appt. with me if you are in need of assistance during study halls or after school
 - **B. Performance Skills -** You will receive a weekly rating (1-5 star rating)*
 - 1. Use proper posture/hand position when playing your instrument.
 - 2. Utilize proper breathing when playing.
 - 3. Use a proper embouchure/stick position when playing your instrument.

*At the end of each quarter, each band member with a combined 4.95 rating or higher in both categories will be invited to an after school celebration of a pizza party or ice cream social.

C. Extra Credit One may earn points through - Mentoring Set - up/ Tear down for rehearsals and concerts, Private lessons on instrument, Attending high school, college or prof. performances Involvement in Honors Groups - Playing at Football and Basketball Games (2 points per game, Dist. V, Bangor Youth Orchestra, All-State

D. Assessments - Assessments will be administered as follows:

1st & 3rd Quarters - Individual and group playing assessments consisting of scales from scale sheet. These will be given during one of your 2 quarterly meetings. (1st quarter)

Evaluation of large group assessment will be factored into each band members grade (3rd quarter)

SLO's - Each semester, student's will record an excerpt during rehearsal from a piece of music that will demonstrate growth (record when sight reading and again a few days before a performance)

Mid - Term - Written assessment -covering musical terms 20% of 2nd quarter grade.

<u>Final Exam</u> - You are exempt from a final exam by participating in the Memorial Day Parade - Non - participants will be asked to do service work organizing music and cleaning up band room.

VI. EXPECTATIONS/GOALS

Each member's leadership in an ensemble is based upon their performance. In general.....

- A. As ninth graders, you will have the attitude of being a good follower. You will take direction from the director and more experienced band member.
- B. As tenth graders, you will help new members because you are experienced in what is expected.
 - C. As eleventh graders, you will assume some roles of leadership and will understand the need to learn with care and concern.
- D. As twelfth graders, as probable section leaders, you will be able to conduct a small group lesson.
- E. My daily goals for you throughout the year are quite simple. WORK HARD and ALWAYS DO YOUR BEST. The enjoyment and FUN can only occur when we are playing at our best. Good musicians do not enjoy performing in a group that doesn't play well.

- VII. UNIFORMS -Failure to have adequate uniform for performances will have a negative consequence on your grade.
 - A. Each band member is asked to provide the following:
 - 1. BLACK shoes and socks. Shoes are not to have any colored stripe on them.
 - 2. Tuxedo Shirt (with black banded collar)
 - 3. Band warm ups (\$25-\$30) and Pep Band Shirts (\$15) may be purchased or borrowed from the music department. You will be charged for anything not returned.
 - B. Uniforms for various activities will consist of the following:
 - 1. <u>Football and Basketball game uniform</u> Blue jeans H.A. Band Warm-up (Football) Pep Band shirt (Basketball)
 - 2. <u>Concert Uniform Tuxedo shirt, vest, tuxedo/black dress, BLACK shoes and socks.</u> (Music dept. will provide Black dress, vest and pants).
 - 3. <u>Parade uniform</u> Polo Shirt, black pants, BLACK shoes and socks. (Music dept. will provide polo shirt)
